General Information

Communication: Email is our primary means of communication. Please advise us of any changes. The Parish Bulletin has up-to-date information weekly. Check the Parish Website for calendars, forms, etc.

Registration: Required each year. All forms are on-line at our website. Please register there.

Fees: Due with Registration.

Attendance: Participation and attendance at all sessions are expected.

Session Times: You choose the time your child will attend. Be polite. Be prompt.

Food: Allergies are a major problem. There will be NO FOOD allowed in the classrooms. You will be contacted about workshops that may include the serving of food.

Special Needs

Emmaus has been created to serve as a beginning program for children with different learning abilities who may have difficulty being in a traditional setting. Contact us for more information.

We will do everything we can to make Religious Education as positive an experience as possible. Help us by letting us know what your child may need.

Sacramental Preparation

Sacramental preparation is a two-year process. In First and Second Grades, children prepare for **Reconciliation and Eucharist**. To receive these sacraments, children **MUST** be enrolled in **both** grade levels.

If coming to us as a Second Grader, please speak to the Director.

Likewise, preparation for **Confirmation is a two-year process.** This is usually done in 9th and 10th Grade but is available for anyone in High School.

A student attending a Catholic high school is not required to attend religious education classes in the 9th Grade; however, they must be registered (at no cost) to remain on our lists. They are expected to be part of the entire Confirmation II year.

Safety

Pick up/Drop off of children: Approach the Religious Education building from the Memorial School driveway. Drop off is at the top of the hill in front of the Upper Doors of the Religious Education building. Please note the NO PARKING areas. DO NOT COME UP THE HILL TO THE SCHOOL. THIS IS SO DANGEROUS! PLEASE INFORM ANYONE COMING TO PICK UP YOUR CHILDREN to come to the upper doors from the Memorial School driveway.

Early Release: A written note to the Catechist is absolutely necessary each time a child needs to be released early from a session.

Emergency Policies

If your child is hurt or becomes ill...

We will phone your numbers in the following order – cell phone, home phone, and emergency number.

If the Religious Education building is compromised...

Children will be escorted to the lower Church. We will notify families as best we can and will keep the children safely together until you have arrived. Come to the Main Parking Lot of the Church.

If the entire property is compromised...

The children will be escorted to Memorial School. We will wait there until parents arrive.
